CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT (2011)

INTRODUCTION

It is with great pleasure that I welcome distinguished shareholders, invited guests, ladies and gentlemen to the 34th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of Nigeria Reinsurance Corporation and to present to you the Annual Reports and Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 31st December, 2011.

OPERATING ENVIRONMENT

The period under review was largely characterized by the general elections. Nigeria had a remarkable experience in 2011 with a successful presidential election although blighted



by post-election violence. Consequently, the economy experienced a slowdown in the first quarter of the year due to concerns around the elections with its attendant tensions. However, progress was made with reforms that delivered strong gains. The government strengthened financial institutions and is gradually undertaking additional reforms to improve the economy structurally. Investment in power and other infrastructure continue to be areas of focus, although their impact is yet to be felt.

Despite the positive economic prediction of robust growth prospects for developing and emerging markets like Nigeria, the major indices reveal that Nigeria fell short of its growth potential in 2011 with the lack of infrastructural development accounting for the major drawback. The situation was further compounded by resurgence of violence and insecurity, especially in the Northern parts of Nigeria, posing a major risk to foreign direct investment and existing business operations in the affected areas of the country.

In addition to these developments, unemployment, low insurance penetration and rate cutting remain the concerns of insurance practitioners.

OPERATING 2011 RESULTS

The period under review was a challenging year for the industry and for your Company. A Gross Premium of N945.78 million was written. There was a 64% increase in the Underwriting result from N277 million to N453 million in 2011 due largely to the conservative underwriting approach adopted by the Corporation as well as restriction of operation to selected markets. The claim expenses also saw a decline from N623.59 million in 2010 to N347.03 in 2011, a reduction of 45%. This again was as a result of a remarkable improvement in Claims Management and treaty terms. A major challenge that the Corporation had to deal with during the year was the issue of rising old outstanding claims in the International Operations. The Corporation had to deal with this through successful commutation agreements and settlements. The result of this was the

significant reduction in the outstanding loss provision. However, the bottom line reported a N2.23 billion loss arising from huge provisions made for non-performing investments.

THE BOARD

There were slight changes on the composition of the Board during the period under review, some members retired but have since been replaced.

May I use this opportunity to thank the retiring Board members for their contributions to the Corporation and to wish them well in their future endeavours.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The directors submit hereunder their report and the audited financial statements of the Corporation for the year ended 31st December, 2011.

2. Principal activities

The Corporation is engaged in Life and General Reinsurance business.

3. Review of business and future development

Gross premium earned and net premium earned decreased substantially by 18% to N1.17 billion and N1.05 billion respectively. The rate of retention reduced significantly from 98% to 90% for the respective years of 2010 and 2011 as a strategic measure to manage risk.

Profit before prior year adjustments and exceptional items was N399 million, a significant improvement from the profit of N44 million in 2010. The loss after exceptional items and prior year adjustments was N2.23 billion as opposed to the profit of N344 million in 2010.

4. Directors' responsibility on financial statements

The directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Corporation at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss for the financial year and comply with the requirements of the Companies and Allied Matters Act, 1990. In doing so, they ensure that:

- * Adequate internal control procedures are instituted which as far as is reasonably possible, safeguard the assets and prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.
- Proper accounting records are maintained.
 Applicable accounting standards are followed.

- * Suitable accounting policies are used and consistently applied.
- * The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis unless it is not appropriate to presume that the Corporation will continue in business.
- * Judgements and estimates made are reasonable and prudent.

5. **Donations**

No donation was made to any political organization.

6. Personnel

(a) Employment of physically challenged persons

It is the policy of the Corporation that there should be no discrimination in considering applications for employment including those from physically challenged persons. All employees whether or not physically challenged are given equal opportunities to develop.

(b) Health, safety at work and welfare of employees

Health and safety regulations are in force within the Corporation's premises and employees are aware and observe the regulations to guarantee maximum protection of personnel and also to protect the Corporation's assets. The Corporation provides subsidies to all levels of employees for medical expenses, transportation, housing, lunch, etc.

(c) Employees' involvement

Employees are kept fully informed regarding the Corporation's performance and the Corporation continues with its open door policy whereby views of employees are sought and given due consideration on matters which particularly affect them.

Training is carried out at various levels through in-house and external courses. The Corporation's expanding skill-base has been extended by a range of training provided to the employees whose opportunity for career development within the Corporation has been enhanced.

7. Auditors

Messrs. A. T. Folowosele & Associates, Chartered Accountants, have indicated their willingness to continue as auditors of the Corporation. A resolution will be proposed to authorise the directors to fix their remuneration.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF NIGERIA REINSURANCE CORPORATION



We have audited the financial statements of Nigeria Reinsurance Corporation set out on pages 14 to 34 which have been prepared on the basis of the accounting policies set out on pages 9 to 13.

Directors' responsibilities for the Financial Statements

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 334 and 335 of the Companies and Allied Matters Act, 1990, the directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion thereof.

Auditors' responsibilities for the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to express an independent opinion on the financial statements based on the audit.

Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with international standards on auditing issued by the International Federation of Accountants. An audit includes examination, on a test basis of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgments made by the Directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or any other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion, we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements and assessed whether the Company's accounting records have been properly kept.

Contraventions

The Corporation contravened certain provisions of the Insurance Act 2003 and guidelines of the National Insurance Commission. The details of these contraventions are disclosed in Note 31 to the financial statements.

The deficit in the solvency margin for general business is N1,062,968,000 whilst the shortfall in the statutorily prescribed shareholders' funds for life business is N484,122,000.

Opinion

Included in cash and short terms funds is the sum of N4.8 billion held under lien in respect of a pending litigation. The Corporation is not directly involved in the litigation but is joined as a co-defendant.

In our opinion, except for the effect of any adjustment that may arise on the immediate preceding paragraph, the Corporation has kept proper accounting records and the financial statements are in agreement therewith. The financial statements drawn up in conformity with generally accepted accounting standards, give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Corporation as at 31st December, 2011 and the financial performance and the cash flow statement for the year ended on that date and have been properly prepared to comply with the requirements of the Companies and Allied Matters Act 1990, the Insurance Act 2003 and the relevant statements of accounting standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council of Nigeria.

CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Corporation in the preparation of its financial statements:

1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of leasehold land, buildings, investment properties and quoted investments at valuation.

2. Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less accumulated depreciation.

3. Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on a straight line basis at annual rates estimated to write off the cost or valuation over the estimated useful lives as follows:

Leasehold land and buildings	5%
Household furniture, fittings and equipment	20%
Office furniture, fittings and equipment	20%
Plant and machinery	10%
Motor vehicles	25%
Capital work-in-progress	Nil

4. Long term Investments

- i. Quoted investments are stated at market valuation. Surplus arising on revaluation is credited to a revaluation reserve account. Diminution in value of the quoted investments is considered to be temporary and is set against the revaluation reserve account balance.
- ii. Unquoted investments are stated at cost unless there is a permanent diminution in their value for which appropriate provision is made for loss.
- iii. Investments in government securities are stated at cost. No provision is made for diminution in the value thereof as the directors intend to hold them till maturity when they will be realized at par.

5. Investment property

An investment property is an investment in land and buildings held for generating income or capital appreciation and not occupied substantially for use in operations. An occupation of more than 15% of the property by the company is considered substantial. Investment properties are carried in the balance sheet at their market values and revalued periodically. Investment properties are stated at valuation and are not subjected to periodic charges for depreciation.

6. Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded in the books at the rates of exchange ruling on the dates of the transactions. Balances in foreign currencies are converted to Naira at the rate of exchange ruling on the balance sheet date. The differences arising therefrom are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

7. Debtors

Debtors are stated after deduction of provision made for specific debts considered to be doubtful of recovery.

In line with the statutory guidelines set by NAICOM, the allowances for outstanding premium are made as follows:

Period Outstanding	% allowance required
0 - 90 days	Nil
91 - 180 days	50%
Over 180 days	100%

8. Investment income

Interest receivable on dated investments and dividends are credited when due and declared respectively.

9. Underwriting accounts

Statements of account received form ceding companies during the financial year are reflected in the accounts in the same year. All underwriting accounts are maintained on an annual accounting basis.

10. Revenue accounts

i. Basis of accounting

The company adopts the annual basis of accounting for general reinsurance business and the fund accounting basis for life business.

ii. Life Fund

Actuarial valuation of life fund is carried out not beyond every three years and the surplus/deficit arising therefrom is reflected in the life revenue account.

iii. Underwriting results

The underwriting results are stated after recognizing claims, commissions, direct expenses and reserves.

11. Premium

i. Gross Premium Written

Gross Premium Written is recognized at the point of attachment of risk to a policy before deducting retrocession.

ii. Gross Premium Earned

Gross Premium Earned is gross premium written after adjusting for the unearned portion of the premium.

iii. Unearned Premium

All written premium relating to risk for periods falling beyond the reporting accounting period.

iv. Net Premium

Net Premium represents the total amount invoiced to ceding companies less retrocession premium.

12. Claims

i. Gross Claims Paid

This is the direct claims paid during the year including retrocession claims.

ii. Gross Claims Incurred

This is made up of claims and handling expenses paid during the year after adjusting for the movement in the provision for outstanding claims and claims incurred but not reported (IBNR).

iii. Net Claims Incurred

This is the gross claims incurred after adjusting for retrocession claims recoveries.

13. Taxation

The Corporation is not liable to income tax in accordance with the enabling Act.

14. Pension scheme

The Corporation maintains a pension scheme for the benefit of its employees. Contribution to the staff pension scheme is made in line with the Pension Reform Act 2004 with employers and employees contributing $7\frac{1}{2}$ % each of emoluments. The Corporation also operates a gratuity scheme which is based on employees' years of service and it is non-contributory. The contribution made by the company is charged to the profit and loss account.

15. Reinsurance funds

In accordance with the Insurance Act 2003, the underwriting profit is arrived at after charging the amount required in respect of the following technical reserves:

a) Unexpired risks

In accordance with the collective agreement reached between the National Insurance Commission and the professional reinsurance Association of Nigeria, provision for unexpired risks is provided at the following rates:

• Marine Cargo	45% of Net premium written
 Other classes 	25% of Net premium written

b) Outstanding claims

Provision made is the sum equal to the total estimated amount of all outstanding claims with an additional provision of 10% of the claims incurred but not reported at the end of the year.

c) Contingency reserve fund

Provision is made at the following rates for contingency reserve as specified by Section 22(1) (b) of the Insurance Act, 2003.

- Life Higher of 1% of Gross premium or 10% of net profit.
- General Higher of 3% of Gross premium or 20% of net profit.

16. Provisions

Provision is recognized when there is a present obligation whether legal or constructive as a result of a past event for which it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligations in accordance with the Statement of accounting Standard (SAS) 23.

17. Segment Reporting

A segment is a distinguishable component of an entity that is engaged in providing related products or services (business segment), or in providing products or services within a particular economic environment (geographical segment), which is subject to risk and rewards that are different from other segments. The business segments are determined by management based on the internal reporting structure.

No segment information is presented in respect of the Corporation's business and geographical segments as the business is principally that of reinsurance and within the same geographical location.
